

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


Writing task: Write an imaginative recount about 2 animals that visit Shaun's new animal salon.



Tuesday: Comprehension

Kookaburra

Have you heard a kookaburra's call? It sounds like a laugh, but the kookaburra is not really laughing. The kookaburra's loud call is a warning to other birds to stay away.



Where do kookaburras live?

Kookaburras live in trees. They can be found in eastern Australia, Tasmania and south-west Western Australia.

Colour

Kookaburras are white and brown. They blend in with the colours around them. Camouflage makes it harder for predators to see them.

Hunting

The kookaburra's strong beak helps it to catch food. Kookaburras eat meat and feed on insects, worms, lizards and snakes. When kookaburras hunt, they perch above their prey and stay very still before they pounce.

Nest

Kookaburras make their nests in tree hollows. As the young kookaburras grow up, they often stay to help their parents with the new baby birds.



What hair style they might want and what they might do while they are there?



Today we are going to look at the split digraph bossy 'e'. The bossy 'e' makes the vowel sound long. Remember a vowel can be A E I O U.




Use the information in the table above to help write the beginning of your writing. Remember you are trying to entertain your reader by using interesting verbs and adjectives to describe what is happening.




Thursday: Grammar- Nouns






Thursday: Writing

Remember the middle of the story highlights **what** the key events are and **why** the characters might be having problems.




Example: <u>First</u> , Lenny the Lion prowled through the door. He wanted some blue curls. He sat patiently in the chair while Shaun got to work.

<u>Thursday: Maths – Time</u>


In this lesson you are going to add numbers together to make 20. For example, 2+2+5+5+3+3=20


