Tell Them From Me

Our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted over Term 3 and early Term 4. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

In class each week students will focus on an area within the school and review how to show Respect, Responsibility and Safety in those areas. Please have a chat to your child about this week's focus area.

Discuss with your child how they show respect, responsibility and safety inside their classroom.

Some questions you could ask your child..... Do you have to put your hand up to speak? Are you allowed to leave the classroom without teacher permission? What does quality work look like?

There are many books on loan from the library that are significantly overdue. Overdue notices have been sent home. Please check for OHPS books at home and return these to the school library.




Our Senior Girls relay team, Junior Girls relay team and Senior Boys relay team ran at the Primary Western School Sport Association last Friday.
